

Sheet No. 1 War Diary Month of May 1945 65th Ftr Sq., 57th Ftr Gp. Prepared by Joseph R. Hrusa, Captain, Air Corps.

DAY EVENTS

- 1. Six missions for 20 sorties today. The current advance has lifted everyone's morale to a very night state and we are in hopes that before long the war here will be completely over.
- 2. One mission for two sorties today. Orders came through not to attack anything on the ground. We wonder if this is what we have been waiting for. Tomorrow may tell us the story.
- 3. At last our prayers have been answered; The war in Italy is over. The surrender of all German troops in Italy puts a finish to the campaign. There was little celebrating tonight as most everyone was thankful that the war here is over. We are all praying that the end of the entire European war is in sight. The Squadron flew 4 missions for 8 scrties. All missions were visual recee's and no attacks were made.
- 4. No flying at all today! Today has been a day of rest and pr prayer.
- 5. The allied armies in Germany are making wonderful advances, and it is felt that V-E day is near at hand.
- 6. Still waiting for the end!
- 7. Today the advance party left Villa-Franca to return to Grosseto.

 The squadron has been ordered to return to Grosseto. Everyone is now waiting to see what will happen to the Group. Most everyone is wishing that we will return to the States before we are sent anywhere else.
- 8. At last, after five long years of fighting, V-E day is here. The news of the unconditional surrender of all German armies was received by everyone with much joy. Although everyone was happy, there was little celebrating.
- 9. Nothing doing today!
- 10. Other members of the squadron arrived from Villa Franca today leaving just a skeleton crew behind. The rest should be here in a couple of days.
- 11. Morale is excellent! Everyone is now waiting to see what will happen to us. We are all hoping that it happens soon.

- 12. The movies have started at the Service Group Theater again.
 Two shows a night. The Officers and enlisted men are working to open their beach clubs again. They should be ready soon and will provide excellent recreation during our wait.
- 13. Church services today, both catholic and protestant.
- 14. Training missions in the morning, Recreation in the afternoon.
- 15. The enlisted men defeated the Officers in softball this evening, the score was 14 to 1. Nothing else of interest took place.
- 16. The picture tonight at the Service Group theatre was "Objective Burma" with Errol Flynn, It was a very interestering picture.
- 17. Instead of a movie tonight, we had a U.S.O. show with Roscoe (Stuttering) Ates, Three lovely American girls were in the cast and the show was very entertaining. Would like to see more like that. The Officers softball team was defeated by 66th Squadron enlisted men, the score 5 to 1.
- 18. The U.S.O. show was repeated tonight for the second time.
- 19. No events.
- 20. Catholic and Protestant church services today. Movie at the Service Group in the evening.
- 21. Training flights in the morning and not much doing in the afternoon.
- 22. The movie tonight was "A Guy Named Joe" with Spencer Tracy. It was a very entertaining picture. The Officers softball team was defeated by 64th Squadron enlisted men, 11-3.
- 23. No events.
- 24. Waiting and wondering what is going to happen to us has the squadron on edge. Morale is still excellent and we are in hopes that somethin g happens soon.
- 25. There was quite a party tonight. It was held in honor of our C.C. whos is leaving for the states, and also to celebrate some promotions. Four captaincy's and Five 1st Lts. That is quite a few to be promoted a nd the party was really an affair. There were very few that remained sober during the evenings festivities.
- 26. No events!
